ANTI – RAGGING

(Prohibition of Ragging within or outside the Institution)

The Uttar Pradesh prohibition of ragging in the Educational Institutions Act 2010

(U.P. Act No. 14 of 2010)

- 1. Ragging is a Criminal Offence & it is totally prohibited within or outside the institute as per "The Uttar Pradesh prohibition of ragging in the Educational Institutions Act 2010: (U.P. Act No. 14 of 2010)", passed by the Uttar Pradesh legislature and orders issued by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 08th May, 2009.
- 2. According to the above act "Ragging" means "asking a student to do any act or perform something, causing, inducing, compelling or forcing a student by way of either by words or sign or signal to do any act which detracts from human dignity or violates his person in any way or exposes him to ridicule intimidating, wrongfully restraining, wrongfully confining and injuring him or holding out to him any threat or intimidation, wrongful restraint, wrongful confinement, injury or the use of criminal force".
- 3. <u>PROHIBITION OF RAGGING & EXPULSION OF STUDENT/LODGING OF COMPLAINT</u> Whenever any student or as the case may be, the parents or guardian, or teacher of an educational institution complains (in writing) to the Head of the Institution i.e. Director General, Strict following disciplinary action will be initiated against prima facie if it is found true, he/she involve in ragging.
 - (a) The person, either student or any other involved in ragging, expel from the institution with immediate effect and shall immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is situated, for further action.
- 4. Where, on an inquiry, the head of the educational institution, it is proved that there is no substance, prima facie in the complaint, received from student or any other person. Institution head shall intimate the fact in writing to the complainant.
- 5. Whereon an inquiry of the head of the educational institution and related police station found who ever directly or indirectly commits, participates, obits or propagates ragging within or outside the institution. He/she will be punished by following manners:-
 - (a) Imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to two year or with fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees or with both.
 - (b) Any student convicted of an offence of ragging shall not be admitted in any educational institution for a period which may extend to five years from the date of order or debarring.
- 6. Any student or person punished under the act of ragging may prefer an appeal in the prescribed manner to the appellate authority within a period of thirty days from the date of order and the decision, of the appellate authority is such appeal shall be final.
